heating pads	distilled water
electronic gram scales	dried fruit—apples, raisins, papaya
kitchen timers—small, battery powered	extracts of almond, vanilla, peppermint and cinnamon
AA and 9-volt batteries	cinnamon powder
	nuts – raw, unsalted, any kind—pine nuts are great—no peanuts
towels (any size) string-free—especially wash cloths	puppy kibble
pillow cases	beef, veal, chicken or turkey baby food
toilet paper	laundry detergent—powdered only
zip-close plastic bags—sandwich, quart or gallon size	Clorox bleach—unscented
paper towels	Simple Green
ceramic crocks	masking tape—1” and 2”
crème brulee dishes	painter’s (blue) masking tape 1” or 2”
margarine containers (clean) with lids	cellophane (“scotch”) tape
	ball point pens
plastic cable ties	permanent markers (“Sharpies”)
leather gardening gloves	copier/printer paper
bungee cords	dry and wet erase pens — fine point
exterior grade plywood (4’x8’ sheets)	post-it notes
2’ x 4’ and 4’ x 4’ lumber	lined notepads
½” or larger sisal rope	steno pads
durable, clean, carpeted cat trees
